Musical Theatre: Shrek The Musical JR. (ages 7 to 15)

It's a "big bright beautiful world" as everyone's favorite ogre, Shrek, leads a cast of fairytale misfits on an adventure to rescue a princess and find true acceptance. Campers will have the opportunity to explore the campus Bistro and the industrial cooking equipment and supplies used to prepare meals for our students. Robotics Camp (ages 8 to 15)

Campers will be introduced to both the VEX and Sphero Robotics Systems. Campers will create builds using the VEX IQ Super Kit and learn how to have their builds perform various tasks using the new VEXcode programming language. In addition, campers will have the opportunity to work hands on with BOLT, Sphero's most advanced coding robotic ball. Campers will collaborate to solve various challenges and compete in camp competitions with their builds. More advanced students will create and program various builds using the VEX Robotics System and VEXcode, which is based off of C++.

Coding Camp (ages 7 to 15)

Acquire basic programming skills, create computer programs with loops and events, and write algorithms for everyday tasks. More advanced students will study programming concepts, computational thinking, digital citizenship, and develop interactive games or stories they can share. NEW Genealogy: Finding your Roots (ages 10-15)

Campers will also gain an understanding of how DNA impacts hair, skin, and eye color. Campers may also learn how to conduct research through United States Census records and other archives. Sample DNA from saliva is needed for participation in this camp. Testing must be done by May 15 to allow time for results to be returned prior to the start of camp.
