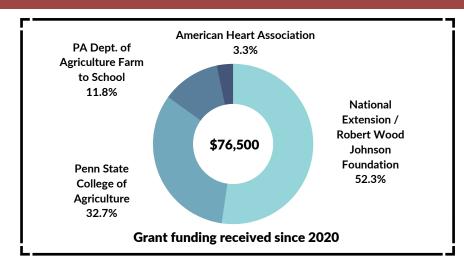

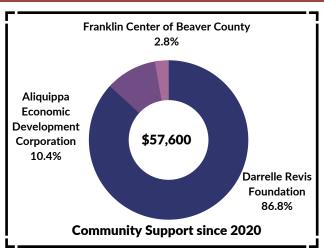
Addressing Food Access in Aliquippa
